TURN WHERE? GPS AND TRIP PLANNING

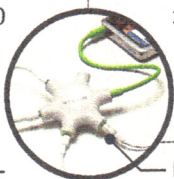

These handy accessories help make the long highway stretches a breeze and keep you relaxed in close driving quarters.

XpressRC, the XM Satellite Radio Receiver features more than 170 channels, including sports, music, kids, and city channels with traffic information; it also has a color split-screen radio that lets users browse content while viewing channel and artist information. (\$169.99, www.xmradio.com)
